



香港童軍總會 東九龍地域 2017 - 18 年報



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地域總監的話

東九龍地域度過了豐富的一年。

地域繼續配合和落實總會的政策，其中在保留及拓展成員方面，與區舉辦童軍宣傳推廣日，並印製升團資料單張派發予地域內各小學及幼稚園童軍旅，協助離校升學的小童軍及幼童軍於社區內物色合適童軍旅等。另一項是不可或缺的童軍服務，本年度的服務包括社區服務計劃－獨居長者家居探訪，以及樂行童軍服務計劃，為自閉症兒童家庭舉辦「原野烹飪親子體驗營」、「親子雙子座流星雨觀賞營」及「太陽觀測和自製太陽觀測工具」。

今年我們很高興與百多位成員、領袖和會務委員，一同參與了慶祝 1 月 1 日遠足活動的 10 周年。我們更創辦了具創意而又能發揮童軍精神和技能的山嶺活動－「東九 Wild Walker」。這個隊際遠足比賽，將於每年定期舉行。

地域代表香港童軍總會與漁農自然護理署於 11 月在西貢合辦綠色親子大露營，協助接待三百個家庭，並教授簡單的露營技巧等，同時讓參加者認識郊野不留痕 (Leave No Trace) 的概念。

本年度地域舉辦了三個海外交流活動。我們完成了亞洲探索三部曲 (III) 的最後一站－「秘境古道熊野行」，前往聯合國教科文組織登錄為世界遺產參拜道之一的熊野古道。我們以 4 日 3 夜進行 50 公里遠足旅程。此外，我們舉辦了東莞考察文化交流之旅，與東莞市石龍少駿青少年進行文化交流活動，並以低碳方式在韓國濟洲進行低碳單車遊，並與該地 405 團的童軍會面，互相交流。

白沙灣譚華正海上活動中心本年為了增加中心的使用率，增加不同活動類別和提供更佳的設施，中心本年度註冊成為教育局「戶外教育營計劃」；新添 20 艘立划艇、1 艘小龍舟、成人助浮衣；同時獲 HKGTA 慈善基金會－「動創明天資助計劃」資助舉辦獨木舟繞標賽、獨木舟及風帆訓練班。更舉辦澳門航海交流之旅，駕駛機動船白浪島號 (Jockey Club Brownsea Island) 及 43 呎帆船 Rajula 號前往澳門。此外，為配合活動與訓練質素的提升，我們同時重組東九龍地域海上活動教練隊。

過去一年，地域活動與訓練部舉辦 105 個不同支部活動與訓練班、29 個領袖訓練班，參加人次共 2,129 人。另共有 216 人考獲支部最高獎章，成績理想。此外，地域轄下八個區亦為各支部童軍成員舉辦了 109 項活動和訓練班，參與總人次超過 2,631 人。

截至 2017 年 12 月 31 日，地域共有 225 個童軍旅，青少年成員共有 9,282 人，比去年增加 440 人，而總童軍成員人數有 11,565 人。

發展潛能



青少年成員獎勵

在各童軍旅領袖的積極鼓勵下，各支部成員努力不懈地考取進度性獎章。本年度，共有 222 人考獲最高支部獎章，包括 159 名幼童軍成員考獲金紫荊獎章，59 名童軍成員考獲總領袖獎章，3 名深資童軍成員考獲榮譽童軍獎章及 1 名樂行童軍成員考獲貝登堡獎章。

旅團發展

在旅團發展方面，地域設有「旅團獎勵計劃」，旨在鼓勵旅團積極參與童軍活動及拓展成員人數，並設有「優異旅團獎」、「最佳發展旅團獎」及「卓越旅獎」三項獎勵。本年度獲優異旅團獎的團共 106 個，獲最佳發展旅團獎共 34 個，並有 15 個童軍旅獲卓越旅獎。



周年頒獎典禮 2017

為嘉許本年度考獲支部最高獎章的童軍成員，以及於過去一年表現積極、推動及發展童軍運動不遺餘力的旅團和長期支持童軍運動的主辦機構，有傑出貢獻之領袖或會務委員，地域周年頒獎典禮於 2017 年 12 月 10 日假聖言中學舉行，讓獲獎者與家人和朋友一同分享喜悅及成就。

團隊精神

地域步操比賽 2017

地域步操比賽於 2017 年 9 月 10 日假慈雲山蒲崗村道學校村舉行，旨在培養童軍成員遵從紀律及提升步操活動水平，並選拔代表隊參加「2017 年香港童軍大會操步操比賽」。本屆有 7 隊比賽隊伍，共 150 多人參與。

冠、亞及季軍分別由東九龍第 137 旅（A 隊）、東九龍第 184 旅及東九龍第 10 旅奪得；優異獎則由東九龍第 137 旅（B 隊）及東九龍第 1585 旅獲得。而最佳司令員則由冠軍隊伍 - 東九龍第 137 旅（A 隊）鄭志偉奪得。東九龍第 137 旅更於其後的「2017 年香港童軍大會操步操比賽」獲得季軍，成績斐然。



幼童軍主席盾 2018 （香港總監挑戰盾地域選拔賽）

地域主席盾乃三年一度地域之幼童軍支部比賽，亦是全港幼童軍支部香港總監挑戰盾地域選拔賽，勝出之 5 隊隊伍才能代表地域出賽。本屆比賽於 2018 年 1 月 14 日在嘉諾撒小學舉行，共有 14 隊參加。各參賽小隊共接受 6 個項目的挑戰，盡力發揮小隊精神，爭取最佳成績。比賽項目除了考驗童軍技能外，當中亦有不同的元素，包括金氏遊戲、繩結、小隊競技、體能挑戰及團隊項目。

比賽最後由東九龍第 1489 旅獲得冠軍、亞軍為東九龍第 138 旅、季軍為東九龍第 93 旅、優異獎分別為東九龍第 195 旅及東九龍第 1178 旅。東九龍地域第 1498 旅亦於「2018 年香港總監挑戰盾（全港幼童軍支部比賽）」中獲得優異獎。



東九 Wild Walker

近年遠足活動越來越盛行，而遠足亦是貫徹童軍訓練之工具及提高童軍水準之活動。有見及此，東九龍地域於 2018 年 2 月 25 日舉行了「東九 Wild Walker 2018」——一場打破傳統又必須運用童軍技能的遠足比賽。本屆共有 12 隊比賽隊伍，各隊由 2 至 4 人組成，於比賽前 48 小時前始獲通知集合地點，而比賽過程中，參賽者須互相合作，運用指南針及地圖閱讀技巧，按照座標指示，設計最合適之路線完成比賽。各參賽隊伍均全力以赴，竭盡所能完成比賽。



發掘興趣



本年度，地域共舉辦了 105 個不同種類的活動、訓練及興趣小組活動，包括：單車、急救、天象、射箭、地圖閱讀、遠足、夏威夷小結他、航空、版圖遊戲等，參加人次為 1,769 人。此外，地域轄下 8 個童軍區分別為各支部童軍成員舉辦 109 個活動和訓練班，參加總人次為 2,631 人。

透過不同類型的活動、訓練和比賽，讓童軍成員在有進度性的訓練下，發揮一己所長，展現個人潛能。地域亦設有不同的興趣小組，以培育童軍成員不同的興趣及多元發展。

STEM 出創意航空活動日

地域於 2018 年 3 月 17 日舉辦「STEM 出創意航空活動日」，活動設有紙飛機製作、模擬飛行體驗及以 STEM 四個元素，包括：科學（Science）、科技（Technology）、工程（Engineering）及數學（Mathematics）設計不同遊戲，讓參加者體驗不同的航空活動，從而了解飛行原理、認識影響飛行的因素，以及鞏固航空知識。



Ukulele 夏威夷小結他興趣班

地域夏威夷小結他組於本年度舉行夏威夷小結他初階及中階興趣班予童軍成員及領袖參與，並以小班形式教學，加強導師及學員之間的溝通，有助提升參加者的小結他彈唱技巧及學習興趣。



地域射箭比賽暨邀請賽 2018

「地域射箭比賽暨邀請賽 2018」於 2018 年 3 月 11 日在白沙灣譚華正海上活動中心舉辦。比賽分個人組及隊際組進行，並邀請各地域的射箭好手前來切磋箭藝及交流心得，從而提升射箭水平。



凝聚力量



就職禮暨籌募晚宴

地域能成功推動童軍運動，實有賴社會各界人士的認同及支持，「第42屆會務委員會就職典禮暨籌募晚宴」於2017年10月3日在胡應湘宴會廳舉行，蒙消防處處長李建日先生，FSDSM蒞臨主禮，當晚筵開33席，為地域籌募經費之餘，各會務委員、領袖和嘉賓聚首一堂，氣氛熱鬧。



荔枝窩圍村懷舊之旅

地域於每年1月1日舉行「地域遠足活動」，適合闔家參與且有益身心。2018年1月1日，地域遠足活動已踏入10周年，本年度舉辦「荔枝窩圍村懷舊之旅」。當日天氣合宜，接近150名參加者由大埔烏膠騰出發，前往香港最古老客家圍村之一的荔枝窩，沿途景色優美，抵達後並在此享用傳統客家盆菜。



中秋盆菜聚會

中秋節為中國傳統團聚節日，地域於2017年10月7日在白沙灣譚華正海上活動中心舉行「中秋盆菜聚會」，讓各會務委員及領袖共同歡度中秋佳節，欣賞美好月色。聚會更設有猜燈謎遊戲，讓參加者感受節日氣氛，大家都樂在其中。



戊戌年新春團拜

地域於2018年2月24日在香港童軍中心8樓粵品滙舉行「戊戌年新春團拜」，藉此鼓勵地域及轄下各區總監和會務委員增進交流與溝通，並藉新春佳節聯繫童軍情誼，以及展望來年活動，讓東九龍地域能繼續秉承童軍精神，培育青少年成為良好公民。



優化訓練

領袖訓練

童軍領袖的素質對優化童軍運動極其重要，童軍領袖是青少年人的楷模，不僅傳授青少年成員童軍的知識和技能，更重要的是灌輸正確的價值觀，輔助青少年成長，培育其成為良好公民。為此，地域一直重視領袖的質素，持續投放資源於童軍領袖訓練工作上，並加強對前線領袖的支援。本年度地域共舉辦 19 個領袖木章系統訓練班及 10 個非木章系統訓練班，總參加人次達 360 人。



訓練隊隊員持續進修系列

地域訓練隊為鼓勵各隊員持續進修，提升專業水平，以迎合現今環境，過去一年特安排連串持續進修工作坊，內容包括：「在職訓練輔導員須知」、「破冰遊戲帶領技巧」、「PowerPoint 精攻 15+ 式」及「地壺球體驗日」，以幫助各隊員在實務上的需要，使其提供優質的領袖訓練。



地域訓練隊日

地域於 2018 年 3 月 25 日在香港童軍中心舉行訓練隊日，當日超過 50 名訓練隊隊員出席參與。除年度報告及未來工作探討外，亦邀請童軍知友社督導主任鄭仲文先生進行「特殊學習需要」專題講座，與各隊員分享及交流經驗，使出席者獲益良多。同日亦設有地壺球體驗活動，藉著體驗新興競賽活動，讓訓練隊隊員加強小隊合作及增進友誼。



地域領袖大會

「領袖」在推行童軍運動中擔當重要的角色，亦是培育青少年成員的重要動力。地域領袖大會於 2017 年 6 月 11 日在香港童軍中心舉行，讓地域內各級領袖聚首，瞭解總會及地域的最新發展方向、探討拓展及保留成員工作，並互相交流心得。領袖大會邀請香港賽馬會災難防護應變教研中心作專題講座，藉著地鐵縱火事件的反思，分享如何於災難現場作出應變。最後，領袖分組討論拓展及保留成員方案，集思廣益。



親子共聚

小童軍親子堆沙 Fun Day

地域於 2017 年 4 月 9 日在麗都灣泳灘舉行「小童軍親子堆沙 Fun Day」，約 200 名小童軍、家長及領袖參加。當日邀請專業堆沙教練教授參加者堆沙技巧，小童軍及家長共同合作地完成堆沙作品，從而增加小童軍與父母之溝通，提升親子關係。



小童軍扮鬼扮馬派對

「小童軍扮鬼扮馬派對」於 2017 年 10 月 21 日下午至黃昏舉行，近 100 名小童軍齊集白沙灣譚華正海上活動中心慶祝萬聖節，活動設有化妝派對、扮鬼扮馬 Catwalk Show 及不同的遊戲，讓小童軍成員發揮創意，並一同感受節日氣氛。各小童軍當日亦悉心打扮投入活動，以不同造型參與。



小童軍親子露營活動 - 大自然全接觸

地域於 2018 年 1 月 27 至 28 日在白沙灣譚華正海上活動中心舉行「小童軍親子露營活動 - 大自然全接觸」，接近 20 個小童軍家庭參與。兩日一夜的活動包括起營、營火晚會、表演、簡易原野烹飪、遠足蕉坑行等。透過歡愉及精彩的露營活動，讓小童軍及家長一起接觸大自然及體驗露營生活，親子樂也融融。



面向世界

亞洲探索三部曲 (III) - 秘境古道熊野行

東九龍地域的「亞洲探索三部曲」，於 2012 年在台灣「勇闖大雪山之旅」展開序幕，繼而於 2014 年在東京「勇攀富士之巔」，本年度舉行三部曲的最後一站 - 「秘境古道熊野行」。是次一行 31 人於 2017 年 7 月 23 日至 30 日遠赴日本三重縣踏上熊野古道中辺路，進行超過 50 公里遠足旅程。熊野古道是世界其中一條被登錄為世界遺產的參拜道，擁有過千年歷史，古蹟處處。參加者穿越漫長險峻的古道，透過朝聖路遠足，反思人與大自然的關係，學懂以尊敬和謙卑的態度與大自然相處，及認識不同的歷史文化。

旅程最後，參加者前往京都，進行一連串的城市探索活動，了解日本傳統文化。參加者更前往下鴨神社參加御手洗祭，跟著當地日本人，一同持著蠟燭，赤腳走在御手洗上，祈求無病息災，親身體驗獨特的日本祭典文化。



東莞考察文化交流之旅

地域於 2017 年 8 月 4 日至 6 日前往東莞進行考察及與東莞市石龍少駿青少年進行文化交流活動，讓青少年成員認識祖國，增廣見聞，並以義教及分享形式讓內地青少年體驗童軍活動的樂趣，是次共有 40 名童軍成員及領袖參加。行程除了參觀東莞市石龍博物館及規劃展覽館外，還透過紅漆描花傳統木屐繪畫體驗、夜遊石龍鎮及城市定向活動，讓童軍成員認識石龍鎮的歷史文化和傳統特色，而童軍成員亦與當地青少年傳授傳統童軍技能。



韓國濟州低碳單車遊

地域單車組過去以低碳方式探索台灣及日本後，於 2017 年 4 月 27 至 5 月 2 日繼續舉行「韓國濟州低碳單車遊」，參加者以 4 天完成約 240 公里的车程，欣賞濟州島美麗的景色。除此之外，是次行程亦與濟州 405 團的童軍進行會面，互相交流，並互送紀念品及拍照留念。



服務他人

童軍宣傳推廣日

地域於 2017 年 7 月 9 日及 7 月 22 日分別與九龍灣區及將軍澳區協辦「童軍宣傳推廣日」，讓區內市民認識童軍活動，並提供機會讓各成員及領袖認識海、陸、空童軍之多元化活動，及地域內各興趣小組，並推廣童軍運動及招募成員。



社區服務計劃 - 獨居長者家居探訪

為鼓勵各支部成員及領袖積極參與義務工作，關懷長者的需要，透過獨居長者探訪服務，促進鄰舍關愛精神，發揮義工服務精神。地域於 2017 年 4 月 8 日與靈實長者地區服務處合辦「獨居長者家居探訪」，超過 50 名童軍成員及領袖參與，探訪調景嶺善明邨的獨居長者及為有需要的長者修剪頭髮。



綠色親子大露營

為慶祝郊野公園成立 40 周年，香港童軍總會與漁農自然護理署於 2017 年 11 月 25 至 26 日在西貢東郊野公園萬宜水庫西壩合辦「綠色親子大露營」。地域連同訓練署及青少年活動主力協助籌辦營地活動及營火會，並派出成員及領袖教授近 300 個家庭起營及野炊技巧，透過營地活動及互動的學習體驗，使社會大眾認識郊野不留痕（Leave No Trace）的概念，從學習中將環保露營的概念付諸實行。

樂行童軍服務計劃

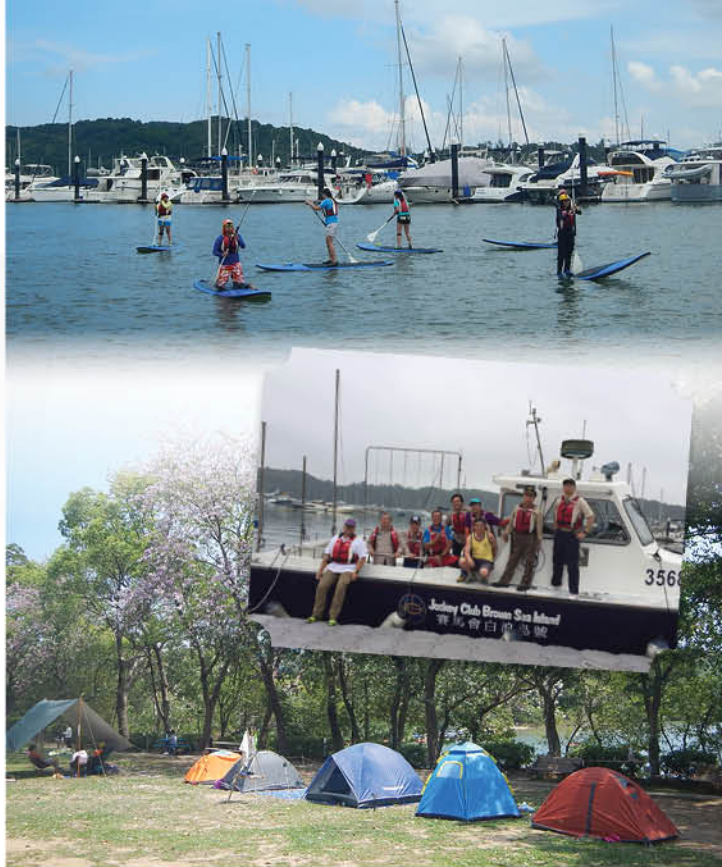
本年度，地域的樂行童軍服務計劃與協康會合辦，以服務形式回饋社會，服務對象為自閉症兒童家庭。地域於 2017 年 6 月由註冊社工帶領，了解自閉症兒童的特徵，並於實習日透過活動認識自閉症兒童。其後與協康會舉辦一連串的精彩活動如「原野烹飪親子體驗營」、「親子雙子座流星雨觀賞營」及「太陽觀測和自製太陽觀測工具」，讓自閉症兒童及家長一同體驗原野烹飪及接觸天文觀測的樂趣。參加者透過訓練加深對服務對象的認知，並透過探訪及活動，建立關愛共融社會。



白沙灣譚華正 海上活動中心

中心多年來，一直深受童軍單位、各制服隊伍、非政府機構及工商機構歡迎，令本年度使用人次突破新高，共 34,787 人次於中心進行各式各樣的訓練及活動。為吸引學校使用中心場地及設備，中心本年度註冊成為教育署「戶外教育營計劃」活躍服務營舍，盼學生能從課堂以外的活動及學習，擴闊視野，發掘自我潛能。

繼往開來，中心在設備上不斷更新，讓各界人士可享受海上活動的樂趣，當中包括新添近年新興水上活動玩意—20 艘立划艇，同時為配合訓練需求，本年度亦增添 1 艘 10 人用的小龍舟。為保障各海上活動參加者安全，中心定期檢視各式海上用品的品質，本年度添置了 90 件成人助浮衣，以抵銷損耗。



在活動與訓練方面，中心本年度獲 HKGTA 慈善基金會「動創明天資助計劃」資助舉辦獨木舟繞標賽、獨木舟及風帆訓練班，共 212 人受惠。此外，中心本年度重組東九龍地域海上活動教練隊，隊員們除協助各訓練班外，更代表中心參與西貢端午龍舟競賽，同時，派出部份隊員連同 5 艘機動艇，作救護支援，令是項社區活動能完滿舉行。本年度，中心亦舉辦了三場獨木舟排名聯賽，反應熱烈，共 281 人次參與比賽。為加強與海外童軍交流的機會，中心於 2017 年 4 月舉辦了澳門航海交流之旅，19 名童軍領袖及會務委員分別駕駛機動船白浪島號（Jockey Club Brownsea Island）及 43 呎帆船 Rajula 號前往澳門，並邀請澳門童軍到船上參觀，介紹船上的設備、航海知識及技術，啟發他們對航海的興趣。

中心於 2018 年踏入第 35 個年頭，我們將會破舊立新，準備更多樣化的設備及活動予各界人士使用，享受戶外活動的樂趣。

2017 / 18 年度區報告

鯉魚門區於 2017/2018 年度已踏進第 37 個年頭。各所屬旅團除了舉行恆常集會及其成員積極參加多采多姿的活動及訓練，他們亦不時主動參與社區服務，寓身體力行於愉快學習當中，大大加強各成員對社區的歸屬感。各類型的服務包括探訪獨居長者、長者家居清潔、護養院老人服務、中秋獻關懷、童心童恆服務社群、協助社福機構與大型比賽組織、漁農自然護理署慶祝郊野公園成立 40 周年的綠色親自大露營等。各成員通過實踐的體驗，使大家“對別人要幫助”的理念更為內化，從而令童軍日行一善的精神得以深入社群。

本區成員參加會內主題比賽方面盡心盡力及全力以赴。其中第 10 旅於「2017 年全港深資童軍錦標賽」的野外挑戰項目獲得亞軍及榮膺全場總亞軍；他們亦於「東九龍地域步操比賽 2017」獲得季軍。至於第 137 旅 A 及 B 隊亦表現突出，他們於地域步操比賽合共獲得冠軍、優異及最佳司令員獎項。於 2017 年 10 月 22 日舉行的「香港童軍大會操一步操比賽」中，第 137 旅榮獲季軍。此外，為慶祝總會青少年活動署成立 20 周年，本區派出 4 名區職員參加 2017 年 10 月 5 日舉行的「銀碟賽—區際邀請賽」，與眾兄弟姊妹同游於喇沙書院游泳池。



相隔接近 12 年，鯉躍迎 SUN 大露營於 2017 年 12 月 30 日至 2018 年 1 月 1 日在大潭童軍中心舉行了。參加者日出而作，日入而息，逍遙於天地之間而心意自得。營友們按照大自然的規律及節令，在既簡樸又充實的生活之餘，透過熊熊烈火將彼此的心靈拉近，高唱營火歌曲，大夥兒繼而又前赴石澳喜迎日出。舉辦大露營為鯉魚門區創造了另一個里程碑！

2017 / 18 年度區務報告

西貢區會在 2017 至 2018 年度正是西貢區成立 45 周年的紀念年，繼續秉承培育青少年的工作，造福社會的抱負，積極參與多項區內外各類服務及社區活動之外，為慶祝西貢區會 45 周年里程碑，舉辦一連串富童軍色彩的紀念活動，包括「西貢童軍技能顯輝煌」全區大露營、「西貢區 45 周年紀念活動訓練基金籌款晚宴」、「西貢區 45 周年紀念章設計比賽」、以及壓軸紀念項目「西貢區 45 周年慶祝活動 - 航天航空探索之旅」。

本年度舉辦了 33 項多元化童軍活動與訓練，包括急救、拯溺、露營、原野烹飪、繩結、通訊、業餘無線電、地圖閱讀、獨木舟、維護自然世界等訓練班予不同支部的成員參加。更有一年一度的「童軍國際電訊日暨國際互聯網日西貢區分站」，總參加人數達 1,473 人次，總參與時數達 39,820 小時。社區服務方面，本年度區會共安排區內童軍旅為區內團體機構提供 4 次服務，共派 60 人次服務 311 小時。本年度舉辦的全區領袖活動，包括「戊戌年新春團拜」、「水上活動同樂日」及「區領袖燒烤大會」等活動，籍此加強區會與童軍旅領袖及區務委員的聯系，同時亦強化區會發展成員活動與訓練的資源。



此外，本年度考獲最高支部獎章的成員分別有 10 名幼童軍考獲金紫荊獎章、3 名童軍考獲總領袖獎章；完成領袖木章訓練的領袖和區務委員有 2 名。更令全區鼓舞的喜訊是，一直支持本區的名譽會長陳偉能太平紳士獲香港政府頒授銅紫荊星章，以及多名區內旅團領袖和區職員獲頒不同獎章，真是可喜可賀。

在發展方面，西貢崇真天主教小學之東九龍第 1764 旅與區會直屬之東九龍第 1757 旅、以及仁濟醫院陳耀星小學之東九龍第 73 旅與區會直屬之東九龍第 1221 旅實施協作接龍計劃，以保留及拓展區內童軍成員，效果顯著。本年度中，本區舉辦「水上活動同樂日」及「全區燒烤聯誼活動」，在成員參與活動之餘，家長亦藉此更了解童軍運動，達到穩固保留成員之目標。

西貢區 45 周年紀念壓軸慶祝活動「航天航空探索之旅」能夠順利舉行，有賴中國航天科技集團公司上海航天技術研究院及中國東方航空公司上海東方飛行培訓有限公司的支持。本區區務能順利發展，實有賴區會長、主席和各區務委員、以及區內外熱心官紳賢達慷慨支持，還有勞苦功高的區幹部職員、旅團領袖及各支持單位的鼎力支持與合作，展望來年本區能繼續推動童軍運動及服務社會。

2017 / 18 年度區報告

2017 / 18 年度區務報告

為了擴闊青少年視野，黃大仙區於本年3月10至11日特舉辦「江門市中華文化交流團」，參加人數有三十多人。旅程主要給予青少年成員實地考察及與當地青少年進行交流活動的機會，令參加者加深認識江門市及其文化，並提升對中國歷史文化和經濟發展之認識，以增廣見聞。各參與者透過策劃和帶領活動，與當地五邑大學的學生互動及交流，藉此向內地同胞宣揚香港童軍運動。

黃大仙區「海上活動小組」於本年度舉辦了立划艇體驗及訓練班，讓本區青少年成員能體驗多元化水上活動。期間「歷奇小組」亦同時舉辦了第二屆挑戰網陣（高結構）技術證書。此兩個小組於來年將會繼續舉辦其他不同類型的活動及訓練，使青少年成員能夠從不同渠道獲取其他不同技能。

於2017/18度，本區透過香港童軍總會「童軍區租用場地集會資助計劃」，協助區內兩個童軍旅覓得集會場地，使能繼續提供優良的童軍訓練給區內青少年。



區內共有26個童軍旅，總成員有1,306人。領袖及委員人數共有314人。在會務方面，非常榮幸得到區會長及區主席推薦，邀得多位社會賢達加入本區擔任名譽會長，他們各具所長，共同推動黃大仙區童軍發展，令本區增益不少。

於2017/18年度，本區共有35位幼童軍考獲金紫荊獎章及10位童軍考獲總領袖獎章。此外在童軍獎勵方面，本年「童軍運動創辦人紀念日獎勵」，本區共有2位領袖獲頒發優異服務獎章及1位領袖獲頒發優良服務獎章。

2017 / 18 年度區務報告

2017 年是本區一個轉捩點，經過多年努力向房屋署申請租用啟業邨新區總部，終於獲房屋署批出一個約 390 平方呎單位租約，供本區用作童軍活動及訓練用途，在 2017 年 8 月 1 日正式簽約，及後在總會產業處及地域協助下完成投標及裝修工程，成功趕及在戊戌年新春團拜內舉行新區總部開幕典禮並邀請到香港總監蒞臨為新區總部主持揭幕儀式，為本區帶來新的發展。第 36 屆區就職禮暨長幼共融嘉年華舉行地點在聖言中學舉行，感謝黃校長支持借出場地供本區舉行活動。

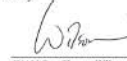

1) Organisation and activities

Scout Association of Hong Kong - East Kowloon Region was registered under Scout Association of Hong Kong under Rule 4.2 of the Policy, Organisation and Rules of Scout Association of Hong Kong. Scout Association of Hong Kong is a body corporate with perpetual succession established under Scout Association of Hong Kong Ordinance (Chapter 1005 of the Laws of Hong Kong) for the purpose of furthering and promoting the Scout Movement in the Hong Kong Special Administrative Region (HKSAR).

On cessation or dissolution of the region, Scout Association of Hong Kong would be the legal owner of all funds and assets under the name of the region.

2) Operations included in the financial statements

The financial statements include the operations of the East Kowloon Region of Scout Association of Hong Kong. The operations of its Districts are excluded. Its principal activities are the furthering and promoting the Scout Movement in the East Kowloon Region with principal place of operation located at Room 923, 9/F., Hong Kong Scout Centre, Scout Path, Austin Road, Kowloon.

3) Significant accounting policies

a) Statement of compliance

These financial statements have been prepared in accordance with all applicable Hong Kong Financial Reporting Standards (HKFRSs) which includes all applicable individual Hong Kong Financial Reporting Standards, Hong Kong Accounting Standards (HKASs) and Interpretations issued by the Hong Kong Institute of Certified Public Accountants (HKICPA) and accounting principles generally accepted in Hong Kong and the requirements of the Policy, Organisation and Rules of Scout Association of Hong Kong. A summary of the significant accounting policies adopted by the region is set out below. These policies have been consistently applied to all the years presented, unless otherwise stated.

b) Basis of preparation of the financial statements

The measurement basis used in the preparation of the financial statements is the historical cost basis. These financial statements are presented in Hong Kong Dollars (HKD) which is the functional currency of the region.

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with HKFRSs requires the Regional Executive Committee to make judgements, estimates and assumptions that affect the application of policies and reported amounts of assets, liabilities, income and expenses. The estimates and associated assumptions are based on historical experience and various other factors that are believed to be reasonable under the circumstances, the results of which form the basis of making the judgements about carrying values of assets and liabilities that are not readily apparent from other sources. Actual results may differ from these estimates.

The estimates and underlying assumptions are reviewed on an ongoing basis. Revisions to accounting estimates are recognised in the period in which the estimate is revised if the revision affects only that period, or in the period of the revision and future periods if the revision affects both current and future periods.

c) Changes in accounting policies and disclosures

New and amended standards

The HKICPA has issued the following amendments to HKFRSs that are first effective for the current accounting period of the region:

- Amendments to HKAS 7, Statement of cash flows: Disclosure initiative
- Amendments to HKAS 12, Income taxes: Recognition of deferred tax assets for unrealised losses

None of these developments have had a material effect on how the region's results and financial position for the current or prior periods have been prepared or presented. The region has not applied any new standard or interpretation that is not yet effective for the current accounting period.

d) Income and expenditure recognition

Income and expenditure are accounted for on an accrual basis except for donations, raffle income and fund raising activities income which are accounted for when the rights to receive payment is established.

Income not designated for any specific purpose is dealt with in the statement of income and expenditure and transferred to the accumulated fund at the discretion of the Regional Executive Committee.

Interest income from a financial asset, excluding financial assets at fair value through income and expenditure, is accrued on a time basis, by reference to the principal outstanding and at the effective interest rate applicable, which is the rate that exactly discounts the estimated future cash receipts through the expected life of the financial asset to that asset's net carrying amount.

Donation not designated for any specific purpose is utilised at the discretion of the Regional Executive Committee.

e) Leasehold improvements, computerisation, furniture and equipment

Leasehold improvements, computerisation, furniture and equipment owned by the region located at Room 923, 9/F., Hong Kong Scout Centre, Scout Path, Austin Road, Kowloon and other offices are maintained either at nominal value or at cost to the region less subsequent accumulated depreciation and any subsequent accumulated impairment losses (2017 - same).

Depreciation is calculated to write off the cost of individual item on a straight line method at the following annual rates:

Leasehold improvements	20% (2017 - Nil)
Computerisation	33.33% (2017 - same)
Furniture and fixtures	25% (2017 - same)
Office equipments	25% (2017 - same)
Programme and training equipment	25% (2017 - same)

At the end of each reporting period, both internal and external sources of information are considered to assess whether there is any indication that an impairment loss recognised in prior periods for an asset may no longer exist or may have decreased. If any such indication exists, to the extent that a reversal of an impairment loss previously recognised in the statement of income and expenditure is recognised in the statement of income and expenditure. Any reversal of an impairment loss of a revalued asset in excess of the amount previously recognised in the statement of income and expenditure is recognised in other comprehensive income and expenditure and accumulated to accumulated fund under the heading revaluation reserves.

e) Leasehold improvements, computerisation, furniture and equipment (continued)

An item of leasehold improvements, computerisation, furniture and equipment is derecognised upon disposal or when no future economic benefits are expected to arise from the continued use of the asset. Any gain or loss arising on derecognition of the asset (calculated as the difference between the net disposal proceeds and the carrying amount of the item) is included in the statement of income and expenditure in the period in which the item is derecognised.

f) Inventories

Inventories are valued at the lower of cost and net realisable value. Cost is determined using the first-in, first-out (FIFO) method and comprises all cost of purchases and other cost incurred in bringing the inventories to their present location and condition. It excludes borrowing costs. Net realisable value is the estimated selling price in the ordinary course of business, less applicable variable selling expenses.

When inventories are sold, the carrying amount of those inventories is recognised as an expense in the period in which the related revenue is recognised. The amount of any write-down of inventories to net realisable value and all losses of inventories are recognised as an expense in the period the write-down or loss occurs. The amount of any reversal of any write-down of inventories is recognised as a reduction in the amount of inventories recognised as an expense in the period in which the reversal occurs.

g) Taxation

The region is exempted from Hong Kong Profits Tax under Section 88 of the Inland Revenue Ordinance.

h) Designated funds

i) Ng Tai Tai Scout Fund

The Ng Tai Tai Scout Fund is represented by funds available for provision of financial assistance for activities with the aim to develop Scout Movement of the East Kowloon Region.

j) Internal designated funds

i) Regional Scout Fund

Regional Scout Fund is represented by funds available for provision of funds and assistance for the development of the Scout Movement in the East Kowloon Region.

ii) Programme and Training Fund

Programme and Training Fund is represented by funds available for provision of funds and assistance for programme and training of the Scout Movement of East Kowloon Region.

iii) East Kowloon Region Replacement Amortisation Reserves

The East Kowloon Region Replacement Amortisation Reserves are represented by the net book value of property, plant and equipments funded by various donors. Transfers to the replacement amortisation reserves represent additions during the year. Transfers from the replacement amortisation reserves to the statement of income and expenditure represent the corresponding depreciation charged for the year.

j) Employee benefits

i) Short term employee benefits and contributions to defined contribution retirement plans

Salaries, annual bonus, paid annual leave, contribution to defined contribution retirement plans and the cost of non-monetary benefits are accrued in the year in which the associated services are rendered by employees. Where payment or settlement is deferred and the effect would be material, these amounts are stated at their present values.

ii) Pension obligations

The region operates a defined contribution retirement scheme under the Occupational Retirement Schemes Ordinance ("ORSO scheme") and a mandatory provident fund scheme ("MPF scheme") in Hong Kong, the assets of which are held in separate trustee-administered funds. Both the region and the employees are required to contribute a fixed percentage of the employees' basic salaries and relevant income per month. The region has no further payment obligations once the contributions have been paid. The contributions are recognised as employee benefit expense when they are due. Prepaid contributions are recognised as an asset to the extent that a cash refund or a reduction in the future payments is available.

k) Leases

Leases in which a significant portion of the risks and rewards of ownership are retained by the lessors are classified as operating leases. Payments made under operating leases (net of any incentives received from the lessor) are recognised in the statement of comprehensive income in equal instalments over the period covered by the lease terms.

l) Cash and cash equivalents

Cash and cash equivalents comprise cash at bank and on hand, demand deposits with banks and other financial institutions, and short-term, highly liquid investments that are readily convertible into known amounts of cash and which are subject to an insignificant risk of changes in value, having been within three months of maturity at acquisition. Bank overdrafts that are repayable on demand and form an integral part of the region's cash management are also included as a component of cash and cash equivalents for the purpose of the statement of cash flows.

m) Provisions and contingent liabilities

Provisions are recognised for other liabilities of uncertain timing or amount when the region has a legal or constructive obligation arising as a result of a past event, it is probable that an outflow of economic benefits will be required to settle the obligation and a reliable estimate can be made. Where the time value of money is material, provisions are stated at the present value of the expenditures expected to settle the obligation.

Where it is not probable that an outflow of economic benefits will be required, or the amount cannot be estimated reliably, the obligation is disclosed as a contingent liability, unless the probability of outflow of economic benefits is remote. Possible obligations, whose existence will only be confirmed by the occurrence or non-occurrence of one or more future events are also disclosed as contingent liabilities unless the probability of outflow of economic benefits is remote.

n) Trade and other receivables

Trade and other receivables are initially recognised at fair value and subsequently measured at amortised cost using the effective interest method, less any allowance for impairment of doubtful debts, except where the receivables are interest-free loans made to related parties without any fixed repayment terms or the effect of discounting is immaterial. In such cases, the receivables are stated at cost less allowance for impairment of doubtful debts.

o) Trade and other payables

Trade and other payables are initially recognised at fair value, net of transaction costs incurred and subsequently measured at amortised cost using the effective interest method unless the effect of discounting would be immaterial, in which case they are stated at cost.

p) Related parties

a) A person, or a close member of that person's family, is related to the region if that person:

- Has control or joint control over the region; or
- Has significant influence over the region; or
- Is a member of the key management personnel of the region or the region's parent.

b) An entity is related to the region if any of the following conditions applies:

- The entity and the region are members of the same group (which means the parent, subsidiary and fellow subsidiary is related to the others); or
- One entity is an associate or joint venture of the other entity (or an associate or joint venture of a member of a group of which the other entity is a member); or
- Both entities are joint ventures of the same third party; or
- One entity is a joint venture of a third entity and the other entity is an associate of the third entity; or
- The entity is a post-employment benefit plan for the benefit of employees of either the region or an entity related to the region; or
- The entity is controlled or jointly controlled by a person identified in a); or
- A person identified in a) i) has significant influence over the entity or is a member of the key management personnel of the entity (or of a parent of the entity); or
- The entity, or any member of a group of which it is a part, provides key management personnel services to the region or to the region's parent.

Close members of a family of a person are those family members who may be expected to influence, or be influenced by, that person in their dealings with the entity.

q) Impairment of assets

Other current and non-current receivables that are stated at cost or amortised cost are reviewed at the end of each reporting period to determine whether there is objective evidence of impairment. Objective evidence of impairment includes observable data that comes to the attention of the region about one or more of the following loss events:

- significant financial difficulty of the debtor;
- a breach of contract, such as a default or delinquency in interest or principal payments;
- it becoming probable that the debtor will enter bankruptcy or other financial reorganisation; and
- significant changes in the technological, market, economic or legal environment that have an adverse effect on the debtor.

If any such evidence exists, the impairment loss is measured as the difference between the asset's carrying amount and the present value of estimated future cash flows, discounted at the financial asset's original effective interest rate (i.e. the effective interest rate computed at initial recognition of these assets), where the effect of discounting is material. This assessment is made collectively where these financial assets share similar risk characteristics, such as similar past due status, and have not been individually assessed as impaired. Future cash flows for financial assets which are assessed for impairment collectively are based on historical loss experience for assets with credit risk characteristics similar to the collective group.

If in a subsequent period the amount of an impairment loss decreases and the decrease can be linked objectively to an event occurring after the impairment loss was recognised, the impairment loss is reversed through profit or loss. A reversal of an impairment loss shall not result in the asset's carrying amount exceeding that which would have been determined had no impairment loss been recognised in prior years.

Impairment losses are written off against the corresponding assets directly, except for impairment losses recognised in respect of trade debtors and bills receivable included within trade and other receivables, whose recovery is considered doubtful but not remote. In this case, the impairment losses for doubtful debts are recorded using an allowance account. When the region is satisfied that recovery is remote, the amount considered irrecoverable is written off against trade debtors and bills receivable directly and any amounts held in the allowance account relating to that debt are reversed. Subsequent recoveries of amounts previously charged to the allowance account are reversed against the allowance account. Other changes in the allowance account and subsequent recoveries of amounts previously written off directly are recognised in profit or loss.

1) Organisation and activities

Scout Association of Hong Kong - Pak Sha Wan Tam Wah Ching Sea Activity Centre was registered under Scout Association of Hong Kong under Rule 4.2 of the Policy, Organisation and Rules of Scout Association of Hong Kong. Scout Association of Hong Kong is a body corporate with perpetual succession established under Scout Association of Hong Kong Ordinance (Chapter 1005 of the Laws of Hong Kong) for the purpose of furthering and promoting the Scout Movement in the Hong Kong Special Administrative Region (HKSAR). On cessation or dissolution of the centre, Scout Association of Hong Kong would be the legal owner of all funds and assets under the name of the centre.

2) Operations included in the financial statements

The financial statements include the operations of Scout Association of Hong Kong - Pak Sha Wan Tam Wah Ching Sea Activity Centre. Its principal activities are the furthering and promoting the Scout Movement in the Pak Sha Wan Tam Wah Ching Sea Activity Centre with principal place of operation located at 600 Hiram's Highway, Pak Sha Wan, Sai Kung, New Territories, Hong Kong.

3) Significant accounting policies

a) Statement of compliance

These financial statements have been prepared in accordance with all applicable Hong Kong Financial Reporting Standards (HKFRSs) which includes all applicable individual Hong Kong Financial Reporting Standards, Hong Kong Accounting Standards (HKASs) and Interpretations issued by the Hong Kong Institute of Certified Public Accountants (HKICPA), accounting principles generally accepted in Hong Kong and Clause 6(c) of the Subvention Agreement issued by the Leisure and Cultural Services Department. A summary of the significant accounting policies adopted by the centre is set out below. These policies have been consistently applied to all the years presented, unless otherwise stated.

b) Basis of preparation of the financial statements

The measurement basis used in the preparation of the financial statements is the historical cost basis. These financial statements are presented in Hong Kong Dollars (HKD) which is the functional currency of the centre.

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with HKFRSs requires the Regional Executive Committee to make judgements, estimates and assumptions that affect the application of policies and reported amounts of assets, liabilities, income and expenses. The estimates and associated assumptions are based on historical experience and various other factors that are believed to be reasonable under the circumstances, the results of which form the basis of making the judgements about carrying values of assets and liabilities that are not readily apparent from other sources. Actual results may differ from these estimates.

The estimates and underlying assumptions are reviewed on an ongoing basis. Revisions to accounting estimates are recognised in the period in which the estimate is revised if the revision affects only that period, or in the period of the revision and future periods if the revision affects both the current and future periods.

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3) Significant accounting policies (continued)

e) Changes in accounting policies and disclosures

New and amended standards

The HKICPA has issued the following amendments to HKFRSs that are first effective for the current accounting period of the centre:

- Amendments to HKAS 7, Statement of cash flows: Disclosure initiative
- Amendments to HKAS 12, Income taxes: Recognition of deferred tax assets for unrealised losses

None of these developments have had a material effect on how the centre's results and financial position for the current or prior periods have been prepared or presented. The centre has not applied any new standard or interpretation that is not yet effective for the current accounting period.

d) Income and expenditure recognition

Income and expenditure are accounted for on an accrual basis except for donations and fund raising activities income which are accounted for when the rights to receive payment is established.

Income not designated for any specific purpose is dealt with in the statement of income and expenditure and transferred to the accumulated fund at the discretion of the Regional Executive Committee.

Interest income from a financial asset, excluding financial assets at fair value through income and expenditure, is accrued on a time basis, by reference to the principal outstanding and at the effective interest rate applicable, which is the rate that exactly discounts the estimated future cash receipts through the expected life of the financial asset to that asset's net carrying amount.

Donation not designated for any specific purpose is utilised at the discretion of the Regional Executive Committee.

e) Capital works, computerisation, leasehold property and furniture and equipment

Capital works, computerisation, leasehold property and furniture and equipment owned by the centre located at 600 Hiram's Highway, Pak Sha Wan, Sai Kung, New Territories are maintained either at cost to the centre less subsequent accumulated depreciation or at nominal value of HK\$1.00 (2017 - same).

Depreciation is calculated to write off the cost of the items on a straight line method at the following annual rates:

Computerisation	33.33% (2017 - same)
Equipment and stores	25% (2017 - same)
Furniture and fixtures	25% (2017 - same)
Capital works	20% (2017 - same)
Capital works under Environment & Conservation Fund	20% (2017 - same)
Leasehold property	20% (2017 - same)

At the end of each reporting period, both internal and external sources of information are considered to assess whether there is any indication that an impairment loss recognised in prior periods for an asset may no longer exist or may have decreased. If any such indication exists, to the extent that a reversal of an impairment loss previously recognised in the statement of income and expenditure is recognised in the statement of income and expenditure. Any reversal of an impairment loss of a revalued asset in excess of the amount previously recognised in the statement of income and expenditure is credited directly to accumulated funds under the heading revaluation reserves.

3) Significant accounting policies (continued)

e) Capital works, computerisation, leasehold property and furniture and equipment (continued)

An item of capital works, computerisation, leasehold property and furniture and equipment is derecognised upon disposal or when no future economic benefits are expected to arise from the continued use of the asset. Any gain or loss arising on derecognition of the asset (calculated as the difference between the net disposal proceeds and the carrying amount of the item) is included in the statement of income and expenditure in the period in which the item is derecognised.

f) Inventories

Inventories are valued at the lower of cost and net realisable value. Cost is determined using the first-in, first-out (FIFO) method and comprises all cost of purchases and other cost incurred in bringing the inventories to their present location and condition. It excludes borrowing costs. Net realisable value is the estimated selling price in the ordinary course of business, less applicable variable selling expenses.

When inventories are sold, the carrying amount of those inventories is recognised as an expense in the period in which the related revenue is recognised. The amount of any write-down of inventories to net realisable value and all losses of inventories are recognised as an expense in the period the write-down or loss occurs. The amount of any reversal of any write-down of inventories is recognised as a reduction in the amount of inventories recognised as an expense in the period in which the reversal occurs.

g) Internal designated funds

i) Pak Sha Wan Tam Wah Ching Sea Activity Centre Maintenance Fund

The Pak Sha Wan Tam Wah Ching Sea Activity Centre Maintenance Fund is represented by funds available for maintenance of building, ground and public utility facilities of Pak Sha Wan Tam Wah Ching Sea Activity Centre.

ii) Pak Sha Wan Tam Wah Ching Sea Activity Centre Development and Operations Fund

The Pak Sha Wan Tam Wah Ching Sea Activity Centre Development and Operations Fund is represented by funds available for the development and operations of Pak Sha Wan Tam Wah Ching Sea Activity Centre.

iii) Pak Sha Wan Tam Wah Ching Sea Activity Centre Replacement Amortisation Reserves

The Pak Sha Wan Tam Wah Ching Sea Activity Centre Replacement Amortisation Reserves are represented by the net book value of capital works, property, plant and equipment funded by various donors. Transfers to the replacement amortisation reserves represent additions during the year. Transfers from the replacement amortisation reserves to the statement of income and expenditure represent the corresponding depreciation charged for the year.

h) Cash and cash equivalents

Cash and cash equivalents comprise cash at bank and on hand, demand deposits with banks and other financial institutions, and short-term, highly liquid investments that are readily convertible into known amounts of cash and which are subject to an insignificant risk of changes in value, having been within three months of maturity at acquisition. Bank overdrafts that are repayable on demand and form an integral part of the centre's cash management are also included as a component of cash and cash equivalents for the purpose of the statement of cash flows.

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3) Significant accounting policies (continued)

i) Employee benefits

Short term employee benefits and contributions to defined contribution retirement plans

Salaries, annual bonus, paid annual leave, contribution to defined contribution retirement plans and the cost of non-monetary benefits are accrued in the year in which the associated services are rendered by employees. Where payment or settlement is deferred and the effect would be material, these amounts are stated at their present values.

A mandatory provident fund scheme ("the MPF scheme") is operated by the centre to fulfil the requirements under the Mandatory Provident Fund Schemes Ordinance. The MPF scheme is a defined contribution retirement plan administered by independent trustees. Under the MPF scheme, the employer and its employees are each required to make contributions to the plan at 5% of the employees' relevant income, subject to a cap of relevant monthly income of HK\$30,000. The contributions to the plan vest immediately.

j) Taxation

The centre is exempted from Hong Kong Profits Tax under Section 88 of the Inland Revenue Ordinance.

k) Provisions and contingent liabilities

Provisions are recognised for other liabilities of uncertain timing or amount when the centre has a legal or constructive obligation arising as a result of a past event, it is probable that an outflow of economic benefits will be required to settle the obligation and a reliable estimate can be made. Where the time value of money is material, provisions are stated at the present value of the expenditures expected to settle the obligation.

Where it is not probable that an outflow of economic benefits will be required, or the amount cannot be estimated reliably, the obligation is disclosed as a contingent liability, unless the probability of outflow of economic benefits is remote. Possible obligations, whose existence will only be confirmed by the occurrence or non-occurrence of one or more future events are also disclosed as contingent liabilities unless the probability of outflow of economic benefits is remote.

l) Trade and other receivables

Trade and other receivables are initially recognised at fair value and subsequently measured at amortised cost using the effective interest method, less any allowance for impairment of doubtful debts, except where the receivables are interest-free loans made to related parties without any fixed repayment terms or the effect of discounting is immaterial. In such cases, the receivables are stated at cost less allowance for impairment of doubtful debts.

m) Trade payables

Trade and other payables are initially recognised at fair value, net of transaction costs incurred and subsequently measured at amortised cost using the effective interest method unless the effect of discounting would be immaterial, in which case they are stated at cost.

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3) Significant accounting policies (continued)

n) Related parties

a) A person, or a close member of that person's family, is related to the centre if that person:

- Has control or joint control over the centre; or
- Has significant influence over the centre; or
- Is a member of the key management personnel of the centre or the centre's parent.

b) An entity is related to the centre if any of the following conditions applies:

- The entity and the centre are members of the same group (which means the parent, subsidiary and fellow subsidiary is related to the others); or
- One entity is an associate or joint venture of the other entity (or an associate or joint venture of a member of a group of which the other entity is a member); or
- Both entities are joint ventures of the same third party; or
- One entity is a joint venture of a third entity and the other entity is an associate of the third entity; or
- The entity is a post-employment benefit plan for the benefit of employees of either the centre or an entity related to the centre; or
- The entity is controlled or jointly controlled by a person identified in a); or
- A person identified in a) i) has significant influence over the entity or is a member of the key management personnel of the entity (or of a parent of the entity); or
- The entity, or any member of a group of which it is a part, provides key management personnel services to the centre or to the centre's parent.

Close members of a family of a person are those family members who may be expected to influence, or be influenced by, that person in their dealings with the entity.

o) Impairment of assets

Other current and non-current receivables that are stated at cost or amortised cost are reviewed at the end of each reporting period to determine whether there is objective evidence of impairment. Objective evidence of impairment includes observable data that comes to the attention of the centre about one or more of the following loss events:

- significant financial difficulty of the debtor;
- a breach of contract, such as a default or delinquency in interest or principal payments;
- it becoming probable that the debtor will enter bankruptcy or other financial reorganisation; and
- significant changes in the technological, market, economic or legal environment that have an adverse effect on the debtor.

a) Impairment of assets (continued)

If any such evidence exists, the impairment loss is measured as the difference between the asset's carrying amount and the present value of estimated future cash flows, discounted at the financial asset's original effective interest rate (i.e. the effective interest rate computed at initial recognition of these assets), where the effect of discounting is material. This assessment is made collectively where these financial assets share similar risk characteristics, such as similar past due status, and have not been individually assessed as impaired. Future cash flows for financial assets which are assessed for impairment collectively are based on historical loss experience for assets with credit risk characteristics similar to the collective group.

If in a subsequent period the amount of an impairment loss decreases and the decrease can be linked objectively to an event occurring after the impairment loss was recognised, the impairment loss is reversed through profit or loss. A reversal of an impairment loss shall not result in the asset's carrying amount exceeding that which would have been determined had no impairment loss been recognised in prior years.

Impairment losses are written off against the corresponding assets directly, except for impairment losses recognised in respect of trade debtors and bills receivable included within trade and other receivables, whose recovery is considered doubtful but not remote. In this case, the impairment losses for doubtful debts are recorded using an allowance account. When the centre is satisfied that recovery is remote, the amount considered irrecoverable is written off against trade debtors and bills receivable directly and any amounts held in the allowance account relating to that debt are reversed. Subsequent recoveries of amounts previously charged to the allowance account are reversed against the allowance account. Other changes in the allowance account and subsequent recoveries of amounts previously written off directly are recognised in profit or loss.

a) Foreign exchange risk

The Regional Executive Committee is of the opinion that the centre does not have significant foreign exchange risk under the current operations as the majority of the centre's transactions are denominated in Hong Kong Dollars (HKD).

b) Price risk

The centre is not exposed to both debt and equity securities price fluctuation risk.

c) Credit risk

The centre's principal financial assets are trade receivables, other receivables, deposits, cash and bank balances. The credit risk on liquid funds is limited because the counterparties are authorised financial institutions listed in the Hong Kong Exchange and Clearing Limited and regulated under the Hong Kong Banking Ordinance. The centre's maximum exposure to credit risk is shown in note 5 to the financial statements. The centre's credit risk is primarily attributable to amounts due to Scout Units, including risk resulting from counterparty default and risk of concentration. The centre has policies in place for the continued control and monitoring of relevant credit risk.

d) Liquidity risk

The liquidity of the centre is managed by maintaining sufficient cash and bank balances.

e) Cash flow interest rate risk

The centre has significant variable interest rate deposits placed with banks which exposes the centre to interest rate risk. At present, the centre does not enter into any derivative to hedge against its interest rate risk exposure.

16) Possible impact of amendments, new standards and interpretations issued but not yet effective for the accounting year ended 31st March, 2018

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17) Other income to be recognised in future years

In 2015, the centre applied the subsidy from Environment & Conservation Fund amounted to HK\$292,335.00 to fund the Energy Improvement and Conservation Works totaling HK\$443,700.00 which was recognised as non-current assets in accordance with Hong Kong Accounting Practice. Depreciation of the Energy Improvement and Conservation Works is calculated to write off the cost of HK\$443,700.00 on a straight line method at 20% per annum. Accordingly 80% of the Environment & Conservation Fund equivalent to HK\$233,868.00 is to be recognised in future years to reflect the pattern of the depreciation of the item. The cost of Energy Improvement and Conservation Works partly under subvention is recognised in the statement of financial position as disclosed in note 6 to the financial statements.
